#### **Academy Requirements**

#### "Leadership is defined as having the ability to lead, guide, direct or influence."

The Tom Spellmire Academy of Conservation Leadership will take each participant on a journey through various courses specially designed to challenge the individual, improve one's understanding of current and future issues, and develop skills necessary to lead. Each participant will be required to complete **ten** courses offered. Within 3 years, the participant completing the courses will be recognized and "graduate" as a conservation leader during our Annual Conservation Partnership meeting or our Annual Summer Supervisor School Program.

- Visioning in a Personal & Organizational Context
- Customer-focus & Continuous Quality Improvement

### The Academy Costs What?!

The Tom Spellmire Academy of Conservation Leadership program is designed to allow all SWCD Supervisors, SWCD Employees and other partners to participate by attending the Annual Conservation Partnership Meeting and the OFSWCD Summer Supervisor School. Additional courses may be added to winter Area Meetings or other special meetings. All costs are covered through event registration, therefore, no additional funds are required by the participant!

#### How Do I Graduate?

To be eligible for Academy Graduation, <u>10</u> of 15+ courses must be completed. Training began in January of 2010. Records for meeting participants are maintained and updated yearly to track courses completed by each individual. Enough courses should be offered for an individual to graduate within a <u>three-year period</u>. Participants will sign a form during the training event to certify attendance. Once the required 10 courses have been met, the participant will be notified of graduation eligibility and scheduled for the next available graduation ceremony.
