BUCKEYE LAKE TOUR (LICKING/PERRY SWCD)-**

*Limited to 50 participants.*

EXPLORE BUCKEYE LAKE'S WATERSHED IN ACTION WITH GUIDED STOPS AT SEVERAL NOTABLE RESTORATION AND MANAGEMENT SITES. HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE BLOODY RUN SWAMP WHERE ANCIENT WILDLIFE REMAINS WERE DISCOVERED DURING RESTORATION, BROOKS PARK WETLAND INSTALLED TO IMPROVE WATER QUALITY FOR BUCKEYE LAKE, AND A CONCLUDING PONTOON TOUR SHOWCASING THE FAIRFIELD BEACH AERATORS AND CRANBERRY BOG PRESERVE.

**TOUR #2 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE  
TECHNOLOGY FOR TOMORROW'S LAND (COSHOCTON SWCD)**

*Limited to 50 participants.*

THIS TOUR WILL SHOWCASE HOW LOCAL FARMERS ARE USING MODERN TECHNOLOGY TO IMPROVE EFFICIENCY, PROTECT NATURAL RESOURCES, AND SHAPE THE FUTURE OF AGRICULTURE. PARTICIPANTS WILL VISIT FARMS UTILIZING INNOVATIVE TOOLS SUCH AS PRECISION EQUIPMENT, DATA-DRIVEN MANAGEMENT, AND CONSERVATION PRACTICES THAT HELP MAINTAIN HEALTHY SOIL AND WATER WHILE INCREASING PRODUCTIVITY.

**TOUR #3 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE  
THE WILDS OPEN AIR SAFARI (MUSKINGUM/NOBLE SWCD)**

*Limited to 100 participants*

AN OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLORE THE WILDS ON A GUIDED OPEN-AIR SAFARI, TRAVELING THROUGH LARGE PASTURES TO OBSERVE SPECIES SUCH AS GIRAFFE, BISON, RHINOS, ZEBRAS, AND OTHER WILDLIFE WHILE LEARNING ABOUT CONSERVATION EFFORTS ACROSS THE 10,000-ACRE PRESERVE. AFTER THE TOUR, PARTICIPANTS WILL ROTATE THROUGH FOUR EDUCATIONAL STATIONS FOCUSED ON WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AND HABITAT MANAGEMENT INCLUDING PRAIRIE RESTORATION, BIRD CONSERVATION, HELLBENDER CONSERVATION, AND AMERICAN BURYING BEETLE RECOVERY.

### TOUR #4 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE EARTHWORKS TOUR - (LICKING SWCD)

*Limited to 50 people. Comfortable shoes for walking are recommended*

STEP BACK IN TIME AND EXPLORE THREE REMARKABLE SITES AROUND NEWARK THAT INDIGENOUS PEOPLES HAVE CALLED HOME FOR THOUSANDS OF YEARS. BEGIN AT BLACK HAND GORGE, A GEOLOGICALLY UNIQUE LANDSCAPE RICH WITH STORIES AND LEGENDS OF NATIVE PRESENCE. THEN VISIT FLINT RIDGE QUARRIES, WHERE FLINT HAS BEEN MINED FOR OVER 12,000 YEARS TO CRAFT SOME OF THE WORLD'S MOST BEAUTIFUL AND ENDURING STONE TOOLS. FINALLY, EXPERIENCE THE NEWARK EARTHWORKS, WHERE EARTH WAS SHAPED INTO VAST, PRECISE STRUCTURES MORE THAN 2,000 YEARS AGO.

DISCOVER HOW THESE PLACES HAVE BEEN USED AND HONORED BY NATIVE COMMUNITIES ACROSS GENERATIONS AND HOW WE CAN HELP PRESERVE THEM FOR THOSE YET TO COME

### TOUR #5 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE URBAN CONSERVATION IN NEWARK: INFRASTRUCTURE, INNOVATION & COMMUNITY RENEWAL (LICKING SWCD)

*Lunch will be on second floor with no elevator, but accommodations can be made. 50 people*

PARTICIPANTS WILL EXPLORE NEWARK'S ONGOING TRANSFORMATION THROUGH A GUIDED URBAN TOUR HIGHLIGHTING THE CITY'S HISTORY, INFRASTRUCTURE, AND REVITALIZATION EFFORTS. THE EXPERIENCE BEGINS AT THE HISTORIC MIDLAND THEATRE WITH A BRIEF LOOK AT ITS RESTORATION, FOLLOWED BY AN OVERVIEW OF NEWARK'S MAJOR STORMWATER-SEWER SEPARATION PROJECTS AND THEIR IMPACT ON WATER QUALITY AND COMMUNITY RESILIENCE. MAYOR HALL WILL SHARE INSIGHTS INTO THE DOWNTOWN AND COURTHOUSE SQUARE REVITALIZATION BEFORE THE GROUP TAKES A WALKING TOUR THROUGH THE HEART OF THE CITY. THE TOUR CONTINUES AT THE WORKS, WHERE ATTENDEES HAVE TIME TO EXPLORE THE MUSEUM. THE DAY CONCLUDES WITH AN INSIDE LOOK AT NEWARK'S WATER TREATMENT PLANT, OFFERING A FIRSTHAND VIEW OF THE SYSTEMS THAT SUPPORT THE CITY'S GROWTH, BEFORE RETURNING TO CHERRY VALLEY LODGE.

FROM SEEDLINGS TO SAWMILL (MUSKINGUM SWCD)**

**UNIVERSAL VENEER MILL** - WILL GIVE A LOOK INTO THE FACILITIES OF UNIVERSAL VENEER IN NEWARK, OHIO, OFFERING A DEEP DIVE INTO THE SPECIALIZED WORLD OF HIGH-QUALITY NORTH AMERICAN HARDWOOD VENEERS. FOUNDED IN 1978, THE FACILITY IS KNOWN FOR BLENDING TRADITIONAL CRAFTSMANSHIP WITH MODERN TECHNOLOGY TO PRODUCE CUSTOM-CUT VENEERS FOR A GLOBAL MARKET. THIS TOUR WILL SHOW WHAT HAPPENS TO HIGH-QUALITY TIMBER AFTER IT LEAVES THE WOODS.

**BUCKEYE STATE TREE NURSERY** - A TOUR OF THE BUCKEYE STATE TREE NURSERY IN ZANESVILLE, OHIO, PROVIDES AN INSIDE LOOK AT THE STATE'S MISSION TO REFOREST OHIO WITH GENETICALLY ADAPTED, NATIVE SPECIES. THIS FACILITY IS THE ONLY STATE-RUN TREE NURSERY IN OHIO. THE NURSERY WILL PRODUCE HIGH-QUALITY SEEDLINGS FOR PROJECTS LIKE H2OHIO, THE GIRL SCOUT TREE PROMISE, AND ABANDONED MINE LAND RECLAMATION

**BOY SCOUT CAMP PROPERTY TIMBER TALK** - THIS TOUR OFFERS A UNIQUE, BEHIND-THE-SCENES LOOK AT ACTIVE FOREST MANAGEMENT. BY OBSERVING BOTH A CLEARCUT AREA AND AN ACTIVE TIMBER HARVEST, MEMBERS ON THE TOUR CAN SEE FIRSTHAND HOW PROFESSIONAL FORESTRY BALANCES TIMBER PRODUCTION WITH LONG-TERM HABITAT HEALTH. THE CONSULTING FORESTER WILL BE ON SITE SHARING HIS THOUGHTS ON PRESCRIBING THESE VARIOUS MANAGEMENT PRACTICES TO MEET THE LANDOWNER'S GOALS.

**TOUR #7 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE  
KOKOSING RIVER FLOAT (KNOX SWCD)**

*Canoes limited to 30 people. Ages 12 and up. You will get wet*

GRAB YOUR LIFE VEST AND RIVER SHOES AND FLOAT THE GORGEOUS KOKOSING STATE SCENIC RIVER! KNOWN FOR ITS NATURAL BEAUTY, DIVERSE WILDLIFE, AND RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES, THE RIVER WINDS THROUGH THE HEART OF KNOX COUNTY AND INTO COSHOCTON COUNTY BEFORE JOINING WITH THE MOHICAN TO FORM THE WALHONDING. 'KOKOSING' IN THE ALGONQUIN LANGUAGE TRANSLATES TO "RIVER OF LITTLE OWLS" AND EARLY SETTLERS REFERRED TO IT AS OWL CREEK. BRING YOUR BINOCULARS, AS WILDLIFE DIVERSITY IS HIGH ALL THROUGHOUT THE STREAM CORRIDOR AND NUMEROUS ANIMALS CALL THE RIVER HOME INCLUDING BALD EAGLES, KINGFISHERS, AND HERONS. THE KOKOSING IS ALSO WELL KNOWN FOR ITS AQUATIC DIVERSITY. THE FISH COMMUNITY IS EXCEPTIONAL AND REPRESENTS ONE OF THE MOST DIVERSE AND HEALTHY STREAMS IN OHIO. THE RIVER IS ALSO HOME TO THE ENDANGERED EASTERN HELLBENDER AND HAS BEEN THE SITE OF HELLBENDER RELEASES IN RECENT YEARS. ON NOVEMBER 4TH, 1997, 41 MILES OF THE MAIN STEM OF THE KOKOSING RIVER WERE DEDICATED AS A STATE SCENIC RIVER, AND IN JUNE OF 2005 IT WAS DEDICATED AS THE FIRST WATER TRAIL IN OHIO. SPEND A RELAXING DAY IN NATURE TAKING IN PICTURESQUE FARMS DOTTING ROLLING HILLS TO FORESTED FLOODPLAINS AND SANDSTONE CLIFFS ON OHIO'S FIRST SCENIC WATER TRAIL.

**TOUR #8 - 10:0AM DEPARTURE - EVOLVING ECOSYSTEMS:  
DAWES ARBORETUM FIELD EXPERIENCE (LICKING SWCD)**

*Limited 50 people*

EXPERIENCE HOW TODAY'S WETLANDS, MEADOWS, AND RESEARCH LANDSCAPES AT DAWES ARBORETUM REFLECT THE EVOLUTION FROM ANCIENT EARTHWORKS TO FUTURE ECOSYSTEMS. THIS GUIDED TOUR HIGHLIGHTS ACTIVE CONSERVATION, INNOVATIVE STUDIES, AND THE LIVING SYSTEMS SHAPING TOMORROW'S ENVIRONMENT

**TOUR #9 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE  
LIVESTOCK, LAND AND LUNCH (KNOX AND LICKING SWCD)**

*Limited 50 people*

PARTICIPANTS WILL SPEND A FULL DAY LEARNING AND EXPLORING ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO'S AGRICULTURAL LANDSCAPE, WITH A FOCUS ON GRAZING OPERATIONS. THE FARMS ON THE TOUR ARE VERY CONSERVATION-MINDED AND ARE ALWAYS TRYING TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS THAT BENEFIT THEIR LIVESTOCK AND THE ENVIRONMENT.

THE FIRST STOP OF THE DAY BRINGS THE GROUP TO THE CUTLIP FAMILY FARM IN GLENMONT. ATTENDEES WILL BE WELCOMED WITH INTRODUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING A GUIDED TOUR OF THE FARM. THIS VISIT OFFERS AN INFORMATIVE LOOK AT THE FARM'S GRAZING SYSTEM AND CONSERVATION PRACTICES, FOLLOWED BY OPEN DISCUSSION AND A Q&A SESSION.

LUNCH WILL BE PROVIDED AT VELVET ICE CREAM IN UTICA. THIS STOP OFFERS TIME TO EAT, REST, AND ENJOY ICE CREAM, AS WELL AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO BROWSE THE ON-SITE SHOP. IT SERVES AS BOTH A REFRESHING BREAK AND A CHANCE FOR PARTICIPANTS TO CONNECT INFORMALLY.

THE FINAL STOP WILL BE CLAY LICK RUN FARM NEAR NEWARK, OPERATED BY THE FELUMLEE FAMILY. HERE, ATTENDEES WILL RECEIVE AN OVERVIEW OF THE FARM'S CONSERVATION EFFORTS BEFORE TOURING THE FACILITIES. THIS VISIT EMPHASIZES PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATIONS AND CONCLUDES WITH ANOTHER Q&A SESSION, ALLOWING PARTICIPANTS TO ENGAGE WITH REAL-WORLD APPLICATIONS.

**TOUR #10 - 10:00AM DEPARTURE - SUSTAINABILITY IN ACTION:  
LAND ENERGY AND EDUCATION (LICKING SWCD)**

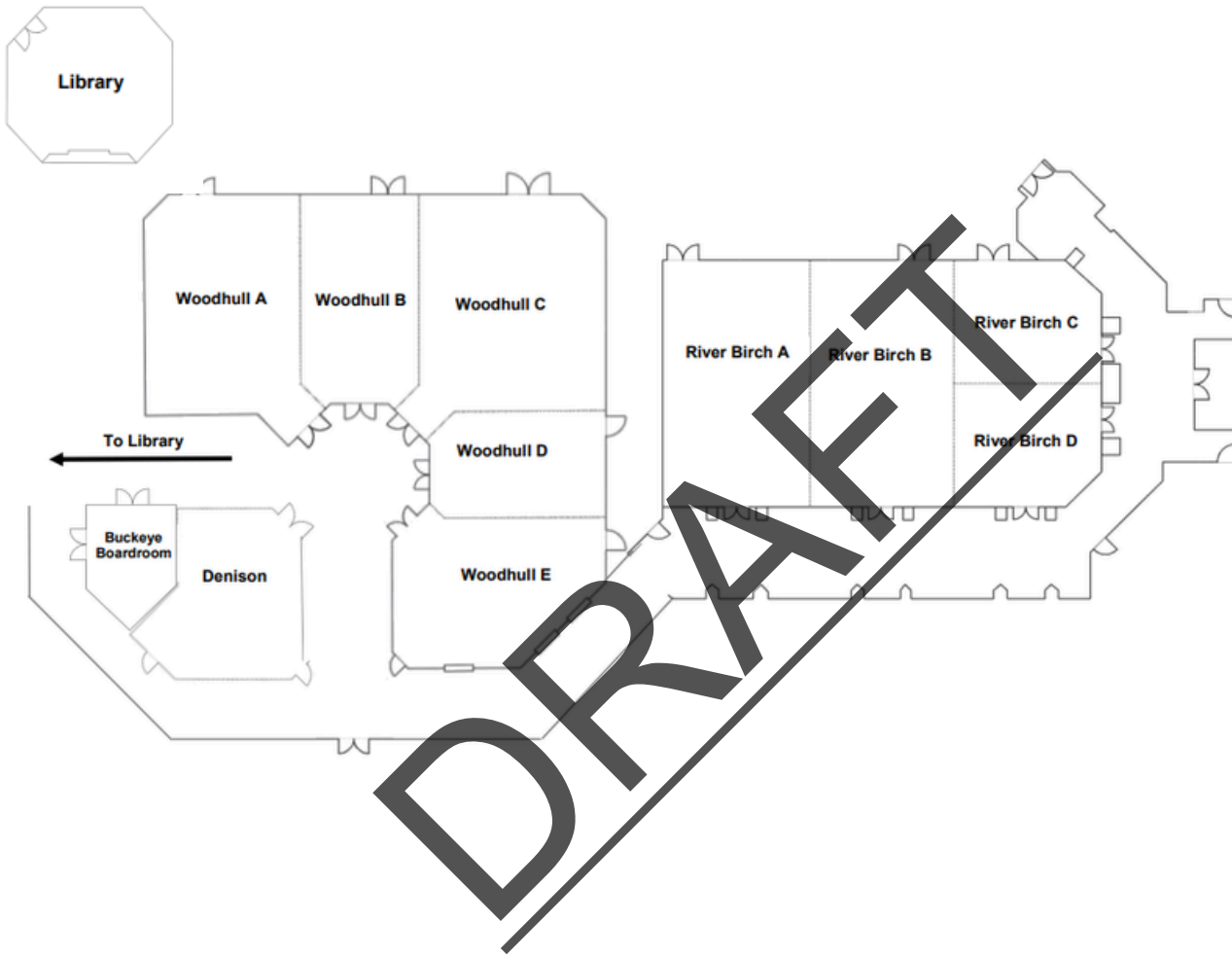
PARTICIPANTS WILL EXPLORE INNOVATIVE SUSTAINABILITY EFFORTS ACROSS LICKING COUNTY SUCH AS:  
GRANVILLE LAND LAB: HANDS-ON ECOLOGY, SOIL HEALTH AND HABITAT RESTORATION
